Editor's Desk cow embarks on business REGISTRATION COMPLIANCE **PROJECT**

You are hereby informed that the City of Windhoek Health Services Division is embarking on a Business Registration Compliance Project to ensure that all business owners and the general public in Windhoek are informed about the importance of registering a business as well as the consequences of operating a business illegally.

The overall objective of the said project is to inculcate a culture of compliance with the Regulations Relating to the Registration of Businesses GN 202 of 2006, General Health Regulations, GN 121 of 14 October 1969 as amended and other relevant National and Local Authority legislative requirements.

Specific objectives are:

- 1. To raise awareness and to educate the business community and the general public on the importance of registering and renewing their registration with City of Windhoek as provided for by the applicable law;
- 2. To sensitise the business community and the general public on compliance and the consequences of operating a business illegally in Windhoek;

- 3. To increase the knowledge & understanding of the business community and the general public on the business registration procedure & guidelines;
- 4. Awareness on the impact of businesses operating without valid Certificate of Fitness/Registration.

Therefore the City of Windhoek is conducting a combined operation implement the awareness & enforcement component of the above project, which commenced as from the 5th August 2015 as follow:

- 1. First week: 05 06 August 2015 Katutura: Red Cross Society shopping centre, Compound to Soweto.
- 2. Second week: 12 13 August 2015 Central Business District: From Banhoff to Sam Nuuyoma along Werner List & Lüderitz streets.
- 3. Third week: 19 20 August 2015 Ombili Woerman Brock Okalindi & Stop & Shop
- 4. Fourth week: 26 27 August 2015 Prosperita along Calcium, Copper, Paladium and Gold streets.

CITY PRESENTS LAND DURING THE PRESIDENT'S SITE VISIT IN ORDER TO MEET THE PLIGHT OF THE URBAN DWELLERS

During the site meeting held on Monday, 27 July 2015, a powerful government delegation with the City Mayor and technical officials took the President, His Excellency Dr Hage Geingob, for a site inspection of various pieces of land that the government will help servicing in order to meet the plight and calls from the youth to avail land for housing.

The city had received mass application from the urban youth through AR (Affirmative Repositioning) requesting land for housing, and an agreement was reached with the president for the national servicing of 200,000 erven. The President took time from his busy schedule to practically see the potential land that can be serviced, and gave assurance that despite the financial limitation, the government will have to look for money and ensure that land is serviced and that it is provided for to address the backlog of land for housing.

Earlier on, the president's A team member Dr John Steitler who had also accompanied the president to the site, had indicated that land of minimum 400 square meter is ideal for the development of decent free standing houses, and that decent homes are at the centre of decent family living and as such people should be given erven so that they can build their own free

standing houses. The City's technical team had reflected that the City had all along virgin land across various geographical corners of the City and that government's willingness to assist is a welcomed development.

The president's site visit included the 80 hectare open plot in Goreangab area, Otjomuise extension 12 and 13 and also the envisaged Venus township development that stretches across the western bypass behind Prosperity Industrial Park.

The president had urged technical teams to do all they can to assure speedy delivery of land, and that his urge for land delivery ties in well with his theme "No one should be left out" poverty eradication and that no one should be left out. The delegation to the site visit consisted of amongst others Vice President Nicky Iyambo, Prime Minister Sara Kuugongwelwa-Amdhila, Minister of Urban Development Sophia Shaningwa, Minister of Presidential Affairs France Kapofi, Governor of the Khomas Region Laura McLeod-Katjirua, while the Mayor of the City of Windhoek Muesee Kazapua, was accompanied by the Chairperson of the Management Committee Moses Shiikwa, Strategic Executive for Urban Planning & Property Management, Ludwig Narib, Chief City Police Abraham Kanime and also City senior

employees.

The site visit was then followed up with a second visit at the organisational level on Tuesday 28 July 2015, which was headed by the Mayor and comprised of the councillors and City of Windhoek employees that deal with land matters. The aim was to come up with a comprised document enriched with in depth information from the responsible organisational divisions and pave the way forward in order to heed to the call from the president to fast tract land delivery to the homeless urban masses.

The delegation visited an area behind Kleiner Kuppe bordering the commonage farm number two belonging to the city, a plot earmarked for residential development in Ludwigsdrof Dorp, Otjomuise Extension 12 and 13 and concluded the site inspection at Mix Settlement located north of the City of Windhoek.

The City has various commonage farms that are bordering the old municipal boundaries of Kleiner Kuppe, Avis, Auasblick and Ludwigsdrof, but are under lease agreements that range between a year to year lease and long term leases of between 20 and 30 years.

SUSTAINABLE URBAN MASTER PLAN (SUMP)

Following the recommendation of the Master Plan, the city of Windhoek as a beneficiary received the consultancy service for "Bus Network Development and Operations Management". This project was completed in May 2015.

Now, implementation has started!

Many inhabitants of the City are already aware of the pilot bus project called "shopping line", a frequent and scheduled bus service every Saturday between Okuryangava and Wernhil. The bus leaves every hour even when it is not fully loaded according to the timetable.

In the timetable it can be seen at what time the bus will depart at every bus stop. The advantage of a scheduled bus service is that people can plan their day. It shows at what time the next bus will come and how many minutes it will take to the next destination.

Brock at Green Mountain Dam Street in Goreangab and China Town via Havana and Hakahana. The departure times are found in the timetables below. One trip is N\$5 with smart card and N\$6 cash.

The new buses are only one part of the project. The biggest impact will be a modern bus network. Remember, the City wants to create the public transport - which is affordable, reliable, accessible and safe. The aim is to have a modern bus network that will provide frequent and scheduled services, running the whole day in all directions. The whole city shall be accessible by bus from early morning to late in the evening.

Currently there is not enough capacity in terms of buses and drivers but the implementation of the new bus network will be done with the existing resources we have. Of course at this stage it is not possible to provide improvement everywhere but step by step it will come.

The Windhoek Jazz Festival was officially launched in Windhoek on Wednesday, the 29th July 2015 at Avani Windhoek Hotel and Casino, whereby the City of Windhoek Mayor, His Worship Cllr. Muesee Kazapua unveiled the international and local artists who will be entertaining the Jazz fans, come the evening of the 24 October 2015, at the Hage Geingob Stadium.

During the official launch, His Worship, the Mayor, Cllr. Muesee Kazapua, underlined the importance and the power of music, saying that music plays a major role in our lives.

Not only does it make our lives magical and meaningful, but music and

society have always been intimately related. Its powerful nature allows us to have a common understanding and can unite nations without looking at geographical boundaries.

"The increased availability of music in our lives seems to be encouraging us to use music to manipulate our own moods, reduce stress, alleviate boredom while undertaking tedious or repetitive tasks, and create environments appropriate for particular kinds of social occasion. In short, music is being used by individuals to enhance the quality of their lives", he noted.

This year's international artists are Jonathan Butler and HHP Hip, and the

local artists are: Fu Jazz All Stars; Lise Ehlers, Sean K, Dixon and Zen-Zo.

The 2015 Windhoek Jazz Festival is not to be missed; the event is organized by the City of Windhoek with the support of its sponsors such as, Windhoek Lager, Air Namibia, 99 FM, Jameson, Avani Windhoek Hotel and Casino and Ad Force.

The festival will take place early this year on the 24th October, at the Hage Geingob Stadium; gates will be open from 16h00.

Tickets to the festival will ONLY be available at Computicket outlets countrywide for N\$250 in advance and no tickets will be sold at the gate.


