



Dear readers, the city continue to make strides amidst challenges to deliver more with less, as attested by the recent release of Otjomuise extension 5 a Public Private Partnership project in accordance the new Procurement Act, ( Act 15 of 2015) through Treasury .

Land remain a pertinent issue not only in our city but also to the rest of the country, thus this financial year 2017/2018 alone, the largest portion of the capital projects is earmarked for the provision of serviced land and as such amongst its major core priority functions.

As per further reading in this edition, the City of Windhoek has officially commenced with administration of municipal functions in Groot Aub as officially handed over on 08th September 2017, with phase one of the transition expected to cost an estimate N\$ 17 million during the current financial year. Mr. James Kalundu, was officially appointed to be the Project Manager for Groot Aub, with the support of four personnel in the interim. The successful implementation of municipal function in Groot Aub is estimated to cost about N\$ 47 million. The handover of the of Groot Aub to the city is a historical mile stone to the resident of Groot Aub as they now become centrally residents of Windhoek.

As part of the bigger global community, the city also take note of recent good economic improvements in the southern

## **BUS FARE INCREASE**



The City of Windhoek hereby informs the public, municipal bus commuters and entire residents of Windhoek that as from 01st September 2017, the Municipal Bus Fare will increase as follows:

- Smart card fare per trip N\$6.00
- Cash fare per trip N\$7.00

All Passengers travelling with Municipal buses are required to obtain receipts from bus drivers every time they enter the bus in exchange of their payments with immediate effect.

Any passenger not in position of a receipt will be regarded as an illegal passenger in the bus and the Bus Inspectors or City Police Officers will demand payment for the trip or he/she will ask you to leave the

In cases where the drivers refuse to provide a passenger with a receipt, he/she should be reported to the inspector or city police officer at the nearest checkpoint.

# CITY OF WINDHOEK DONATES WASTE COMPACTOR TRUCK

As part of the efforts to cement the sister city partnership agreement between City of Windhoek and Okarara Town Council, the City CEO on behalf of the Mayor of the City handed over the waste compacter truck on the 18 August 2017. City CEO, expressed that Windhoek as the capital and only city in the country, feels obliged to assist all upcoming local authorities in Namibia, so that they are able to render adequate services to their respective services.

That the handover is just one of the many gestures that the city offer to smaller municipalities to capacitate them in waste management. The City of Windhoek had also approved and donated waste compactor trucks to Helao Nafidi, Ongwediva, Tsumeb, Otjiwarongo, Keetmanshop, Gobabis and Khorixas respectively.

Windhoek as Capital City of the Republic of Namibia, remained committed to the notion of capacity building and skills transfer in the sustainable waste management and other areas, which can only be achieved with correct waste management systems, fleet and skills, coupled with a political will and management support, elaborated Mr. Kahimise.

As it is a known fact, Windhoek has been known as the cleanest city in Africa, and one of the cleanest cities in the world, for many years, a status which the residents of Windhoek carried proudly and sought to protect jealously.

This level of cleanliness has been achieved through cooperative efforts between the City Council, the private sector, and the willingness of our residents to keep the city clean, as it require a multi-sectorial approach.

Windhoek is growing at a very rapid pace of urbanisation, and as a result more and more waste is being generated and disposed-off in an irresponsible manner within the City by our residents. This situation is putting an undue pressure on the Council, when it comes to demand by residents for service delivery, including acceptable solid waste management.

In an effort to address waste related demands, the City of Windhoek launched the Solid Waste Management Policy in 2010, under the theme" moving towards a areen city" which forms the foundation and framework for the management of solid waste within the boundaries of Windhoek.

Incorporated in this policy, are the continuous Clean-up campaigns, under the Theme My Waste, My responsibility, as one of many tools that the City is using to engage and educate our residents at the community level, to change their behaviours and mindset.

Mr. Kahimise, urged Okakarara Town Council to use the same community engagement model to address waste management related problems, and further hoped that the donated truck will be put to good use, and that Okakarara can equally challenge Windhoek of being the cleanest town in the country.

In appreciation, Chief Executive Officer of Okakarara Touwn Council Mr. E. Katjiku, expressed that the donation took place at the right time because Okakarara Town Council is in the process of migrating from traditional way of waste collection to modern sophisticated technologies that are compactible to synchronized trends of Waste Management around the globe, and that wheelie bins have been introduced for every house hold, and thus necessitating the collection of household waste by compactor truck.

# CITY OFFICIALLY RECEIVE MANDATE TO MANAGE AND HANDLE THE SUPPLY OF MUNICIPAL SERVICES OF GROOT-AUB.



Hon Sophia Shaningwa Minister of Urban and Rural development handing over title deeds documents to Deputy mayor of the City of Windhoek ClIr Fransina Kahungu flanked by Hon Margaret Mensah-Williams, Hon Rachel Jacobs, Governor Laura McLeod-Katjirua, Cllr Hileni Ulumbu and along with rest of City of Windhoek Councillor.

The City of Windhoek has as from Friday, September 2017 officially received the responsibility to manage the supply of municipal services to Groot-Aub. Hon Sophia Shaningwa handed over the tittle deeds documents to the City of Windhoek that was received on behalf of the City Council leadership by Deputy Mayor Fransina Kahungu. Hon Shaningwa at the same occasion lifted the moratorium that was in place to stop the sale of Groot-Aub land, and that the responsibility for land sales now lies with the City of Windhoek.

At the same occasion Deputy Mayor assured the resident that the tittle deeds and the responsibilities entrusted in the City now lie squarely with the personnel responsible to ensure effective development comes to Groot-Aub, and urged the city personnel present to ensure that municipal service delivery is speedily delivered to Groot-Aub. Hon Margret Mensah-William assured the residents that the handover translates to bringing municipal services closer to the people, and that the Groot-Aub residents are now officially City of Windhoek residents.

Amongst other the city is expected to supply services such as: Removal of household waste, allocation of municipal erven (residential and commercial), supply of electricity, supply of

potable water, manage sewer infrastructure, providing billing services for the collection of rates and taxes, provide City Police Function, Fire Emergency Service, Parks and gardens, allocations of play grounds, identify needs for open markets and trading stalls, define land use etc. City of Windhoek Chief Executive Officer highlighted to the residents in attendance that the City will need N\$ 17 million for phase one, and that the range of service will have to be cascaded into phases. He also emphasised to the residents that provision of municipal services to Groot-Aub will come at a cost, and that the cost should be viewed positively as a means to ensure sustenance, but also realistically indicated that the Groot-Aub residents do not have the financial means to pay for the services to be rendered. Mr. Kahimise, also availed to the residents the Project Manager for Groot-Aub, Mr. James Kalundu, who will have four staff at onset to administer the office.

With the expansion of the new municipal boundaries, Groot Aub became part of the new municipal enclave. Currently the settlements face multiple challenges and the road to resolving them is not easier as it require the involvement of various stake holders and strong financial budget that will ensure that the settlement benefits equally from the available municipal services as provided for by the City of Windhoek. The settlement is experiencing a population boom estimated to be currently at 5.000 inhabitants, that is resulting in the increased demand for basic municipal.

For years, the residents of Groot-Aub have been pleading to be provided with basic bulk services such as uninterrupted potable water supply and with an effective waste water treatment facility. Hence, the City will have to invest in increasing the water supply capacity by either drilling additional boreholes. As the City commence its mandate for Groot-Aub, it will be meeting amongst some of the challenges plaguing the settlement such as vandalism, illegal water connections which prevents the main reservoirs to fill up and causes loss of water pressure in the water supply network.

Despite the numerous challenges, settlement has potential to develop into a vibrant economic urban area that the business sector can consider investing in, as it is ideal for the development of warehousing, residential development, and light industrial activities that could pave way for employment creation in the area. Given the natural ambiance and proximity of Groot Aub to Windhoek, should the land be properly zoned and serviced, there is no doubt that many people that are in dire need of land for housing will be pleased to settle there.






# REPAIR WATER LEAKS
